### Terry Huriwai **Te Rau Matatini**

Thursday 15 June 09.00am – 12.00pm Tāmaki Campus, University of Auckland

A practically focused half-day workshop to support Amokaiora and Kaiarahi interested in initiating research or using research within service development in Counties Manukau.

This interactive, facilitated session is an opportunity to bring together people interested in research to:

- Support mental health and addiction (MH&A) services for Māori in Counties Manukau;
- Start conversations around research questions and ideas; and to
- Provide some initial guidance around research options, methods and support.

In addition to facilitated group discussions, the morning will include one or two short presentations from Māori clinicians/researchers who will share their research journeys, the questions that motivated them and insights gained along the way.

### We hope this meeting will provide insights into the research development needs and interests of practitioners in Counties Manukau with a view to progressing research in this area.

**Terry Huriwai** is of Te Arawa and Ngati Porou descent but lives in Christchurch. He has a history in Corrections as well as the addiction sector spanning some 20 years. Terry's research interests have primarily focused on Māori – what works and for whom. Currently a programme advisor within the Māori workforce centre Te Rau Matatini, Terry supports others to develop their curiosity and focus their skills and knowledge in pursuit of excellence.
