### An introduction to the AOD Provider Collaborative

The Counties Manukau AOD Provider Collaborative was formed in 2009 to ensure providers within the Counties Manukau District Health Board (CMDHB) catchment area are working together to maximise positive outcomes for AOD clients.

Funded by CMDHB, the Collaborative brings together 16 organisations delivering alcohol and drug treatment or related services within the region. It seeks to resource activities that are compatible with the CMDHB mental health and addictions philosophy in accordance with its strategic plans.

In fulfilling this purpose, the AOD Provider Collaborative has initiated projects that support the Counties Manukau AOD workforce, contribute to the sector's growth, and help make the services great places to work. Specifically, the Collaborative seeks to:

- Understand the AOD treatment space better... We have commissioned research on topical issues such as destigmatisation, vocational support and aftercare; and have recommended enhancements to service delivery and organisational effectiveness based on this research.
- Articulate a career path for AOD practitioners... By investing in placement, internship and other professional development programmes, we hope to nurture an AOD practitioner talent pipeline for Counties Manukau.
- Invest in the continuing professional development of the AOD workforce...

We provide opportunities for practitioners to enhance their practice by developing learning initiatives and practice tools such as an annual AOD research symposium.

- Promote accessibility for the users of our services... We have mapped the AOD services available within Counties Manukau and have produced a service map to help AOD service users and their whanau to get the help they need.
- Support consumer and peer services and networks... We are investing in resources that strengthen the organisation, coordination and promotion of consumer and peer services across the region.


